


The Rapture


- A. Jesus' promise to return: Jn. 14:1-3 (1575); Acts 1:9-11 (1590); Rev. 1:7 (1800)
- B. Jesus warning: Don't be deceived. Matthew 24:3-4 (1439)
- C. Two different views of the return of Jesus
 - 1. The Rapture
 - a. Believers are "raptured" or "snatched away" silently, secretly, and suddenly disappear, as Christ takes them to heaven to be with Him.
 - b. After the believers are "raptured away" the remaining people (the wicked) are left on earth for seven years to face the period of tribulation and the rule of the anti-christ and the beast.
 - c. After the wicked have been on the earth for seven years, then Jesus returns to the earth with the believers and rules on the earth for 1000 years.



2. The Second Coming View

- a. Jesus will come literally, and all will see Him come.
- b. The wicked are destroyed and the believers are taken to Heaven. The earth is left empty.
- c. There is no seven-year period of time where the wicked are left on earth. Lines A and B in the above chart are one and the same event.
- d. The tribulation happens *before* the second coming of Jesus.
