# Jacob's Time of Trouble

- A. Introduction: Dan. 12:1 (1319); Jer. 30:7
- B. The story of Jacob: Gen. 25-33
  - 1. The name Jacob means "he takes by the heel," or "supplanter" or "cheater".
  - 2. Prophecy foretold his role: **Gen. 25:23**
  - 3. Esau sells his birthright to Jacob: **Gen. 25:29-34**
  - 4. Jacob cheats his brother Esau out of the blessings: Gen. 27
  - 5. Jacob flees to Laban: **Gen. 27:41 Gen. 31**
  - 6. Jacob returns to the land of promise: Gen. 32-33
- C. Details of Jacob's experience: Gen. 32-33
  - 1. He spends 20 years exiled because of his own sin of cheating Esau: **Gen. 31:41**
  - 2. Jacob returns home from exile at the express command of God: Gen. 31:3, 13
  - 3. Esau's attack comes when Jacob is on the border of the Promised Land: Gen. 32-33 (52)
  - 4. It is his brother Esau that is marching against him with 400 men: Gen. 33:1 (54); Gen. 32:3-8 (52)
  - 5. He does all he can to appease his brother's anger: **Gen. 32:3-20** (52); **33:8-11** (54)
  - 6. Jacob clings to God's promises and wrestles with God for deliverance: **Gen. 32:9-12, 24-30** (53); **Hosea 12:4** (1330)
  - 7. Jacob's name is changed from Jacob (which means "supplanter" or "cheater") to Israel which means "overcomer": **Gen. 32:27-28** (54)

#### D. Purpose for the time of trouble

- 1. God gives to the wicked what they have tried to give the righteous: **2 Thess. 1:6-8** (1738); **Rev. 16:5-6** (1817); **18:20** (1820); **Isa. 26:20-21** (1053); **49:25** (1085)
- To purify God's people: Mal. 3:2-3 (1393); 1 Pet. 1:6-7 (1780); 4:12-13 (1784); 1 Cor. 3:13 (1672); Isa. 1:25 (1025); Dan. 3:17-18 (1301); Eze. 9:6 (1220); Acts 14:22 (1618); 2 Tim. 3:12 (1749); 1 Pet. 4:17 (1785); Rev. 7:13-14 (1808)

### E. Details about God's people passing through Jacob's time of trouble

- 1. God's people are now in the land of the enemy. Satan is referred to as the "prince of this world": **Jn. 12:31** (1572); **14:30** (1577); **16:11** (1579)
- 2. By express command of God, God's people are to leave spiritual Babylon as they journey to the promised land of heaven: **Rev. 18:4** (1819); **2 Cor. 6:17-18** (1697)
- 3. It will be at the very end of time when God's people are on the borders of "the land of promise" that they will encounter the death decree and great opposition: **Dan. 12:1** (1319); **Rev. 13:15** (1814)
- 4. Spiritual brothers in Christ will oppose the true followers of God, and push for their eradication: **Jn. 16:2** (1578); **Dan. 3:12** (1300); **6:4-13** (1307)
- 5. Jacob did all he could to try to appease his brother, so God's people should do all they can to place themselves in a correct light with others at the end of time: **Gen. 32:3-20** (52); **33:8-11** (54)
- God's people will cling to His word and promises that He will deliver them: Isa. 41:17-18 (1073); Psm. 9:9-10 (864); Dan. 12:1 (1319) Isa. 26:20 (1053); 33:16 (1062); Psm. 27:1-5 (876); 91 (926); Rev. 12:17 (1813); 14:12 (1815)
- 7. God's people will be "spiritual Israelites" or "over-comers": **Gal. 3:7, 29** (1708); **Rom. 9:6-8** (1658); **Rev. 12:11** (1813); **21:12** (1824); **22:14** (1825)

## F. Appeal – What we can do now to prepare?

- 1. Begin to Learn God's promises now so you can find strength to endure the testing time to come because it will come on all the world (Mt. 25; Lk. 21:34-35).
- 2. Begin to wrestle with God now so you too can gain the victory over sin in your life and become an overcomer.
